	 Individuals certified as EMS or Rescue Officer I and able to demonstrate
	particular competence in the area of rescue operations may be certified as
	Rescue Officer II.
Course Description	This course is based on NFPA 1021: Standard for Fire Officer Professional Qualifications
	(Chapter 5) and may lead to Pro Board and IFSAC certifications. The course is designed for the
	Fire Officer who is ready to assume more of a leadership role by moving into the middle
	management level of his/her department. This course expands on the knowledge base attained in
	Fire Officer I by revisiting some of the same subjects and adding additional material including
	Management, Government Structure, and Departmental Budget Planning and Management.

	$40 \times 50\% = 20 \text{ points awarded for practical portion}$
